## Step 1: Maintain what you've got at least twice per year






Remove needles, leaves and other debris from gutters, roof surfaces, decks and balconies. Regularly clean vents.



Remove all combustible ground cover (mulch and plants) within 1.5 m of the house perimeter. Remove combustible materials (firewood and lumber) stored within 10 m of house perimeter and under decks.



Mow the lawn to <10 cm and plant low-growing, well-spaced shrubs and other fire-resistant plants.



5 Prune trees to create a 2 m clearance from the ground to the lowest tree branches.

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
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
